

Zachary (Zac) Burch is the Senior Communications and Community Outreach Manager for the Naples Airport authority. In this role, Zac oversees all outreach to the public, tenants, customers and elected officials. He also oversees the airport's website, social media, advertising, media and public relations.

Zac grew up in Southwest Florida and attended the University of Florida where he received Bachelor of Arts degrees in Political Science and German language and Literature.

Prior to working at the Naples Airport, Zac served as a Senior Legislative Aide for a member of the Florida House of Representatives representing Lee, Charlotte and DeSoto Counties. Following his time with the Legislature, he served as the Communications Manager for the Florida Department of Transportation District 1 where he oversaw all communications, outreach and media responsibilities for 12 counties in Central and Southwest Florida.

Zac is the Chair of the Collier County Historic and Archaeological Preservation Board and serves as the Chair of the Florida Airport's Council Noise Abatement and Community Affairs Community. He was awarded the National Business Aviation Association (NBAA) 40 under 40 award in 2022 and the Airport Business Magazine and Gulfshore Business 40 Under 40 awards in 2023.

July 9, 2025 Chris Byrne Fire Chief Marco Island

Chief Byrne will be speaking on Hurricane preparedness.

Chief Byrne began his fire service career in 1983 as an entry-level firefighter with the Marco Island Fire Control District, which became a municipal fire department in 1998.

He worked his way through the ranks culminating with promotion to Deputy Fire Chief in 2001. In 2016, Chief Byrne retired after 33 years of service

with the Marco Island Fire Rescue
Department. He was not retired for long
before being called back in September
2017 to act as Safety Officer for
Hurricane Irma. He continued with the
City as Incident Commander of
Recovery. In August 2020, Chief Byrne
was appointed Fire Chief of the City of
Marco Island Fire Rescue Department.
Chief Byrne holds a BS degree in
Management from International College.
Associates Degree in Fire Science from
Edison Community College.


